March 14, 2010

CALLED TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 1:15pm by President Terry Banton at the Milwaukee Lutheran Church.

IN ATTENDANCE: Terry Banton, Debbie Gill, Betty Jean Kendall, Doris Beck, Joan Porter, Roberta Wells, Rayma Stewart, Sue Snethan, Georgia Magarrell.

VICE PRESIDENT: Debbie Gill showed a sample of the bag Hanna Long will teach after the April Meeting. Three styles will be taught with cherries, pears or apples.

SECRETARY: There is a correction in the January Board minutes. It should say Terry Banton will pick up service bars but not the umbrellas.

TREASURER: Doris Beck presented the financial statement reporting the chapter balance of \$55,156.21 and Paint a Season of Memories balance of \$8,107.37. Doris also reported the taxes were completed and filed.

CHARITIES: Georgia Magarrell had 14 boxes completed at her class and now has 20 boxes total to donate to the Shriners Kids. Helga Nichols also needs more boxes for people to paint for the hospital.

EDUCATION: The Trudy Beard seminar will be in July. There were several pictures of possible classes Trudy could teach. There were four chosen by the members to present to the Raindrop members in April. Georgia Magarrell said there were 11 people signed up for the Prudy Vannier Seminar on Saturday and 16 were signed up for Sunday. There was also discussion of buying a projector for the chapter to use by the teachers. It could cost several thousand dollars. This will be presented to the members at the Raindrops meeting after more information is collected.

The acting Vice President would be in charge of the equipment since she is also in charge of the teachers at that time. Terry Banton will also check with the Expo Rental places to see if they rent this kind of equipment.

HISTORIAN: Sue Snethan asked Debbie Gill to take pictures at the April 10th meeting .

MEMBERSHIP: 117 members and 2 new members. Gwen Bennett has asked for someone else to chair this position. Doris Beck will ask BJ Schmader if she would fill this position. Joan Porter will ask

Gwen if she still wants to do the secret pals and state fair programs. Roberta Wells is working on a photo directory for next year.

NEWSLETTER: Roberta Wells wants to encourage everyone who can, to receive their newsletter by e-mail.

RETREAT: Debbie Gill reported the expenses from Retreat in January. The Retreat for next year will be at Collins Retreat Center in Eagle Creek, Oregon, April 2nd and 3rd. If any one wants to go on the Friday before, they must pay for the extra day and breakfast.

CHAPTER BOOTH: Rayma Stewart will have a day to paint spring ornaments for the convention on Friday April 23rd.

LEARN TO PAINT: Georgia Magarrell will check with the Jo-Ann Fabric and Craft store to plan a Learn to Paint day and Marie Morris will check in the Vancouver area.

SUNSHINE LADY: Jeanine Maurer had surgery and is doing well.

OLD BUSINESS: The board members will continue to paint pieces for the drawing of names entered for donations.

NEW BUSINESS: Terry Banton will check with Raindrop members to see if anyone wants to participate in the Painting For Freedom program and ask who would head this up. Sue Snethan asked if we could make up bookmarks to hand out at Nationals and the Seattle Convention. Prices well be checked out for this. Small drink umbrellas could be used at the convention promotion table. Georgia Magarrell made a motion that we have a drawing for 3 registrations to our next convention. Joan Porter second the motion. Motion passed. It was also suggested we might have a drawing for some painted umbrellas. These could be picked up at our convention booth. Doris Beck will check with the Monarch to see if we can have our convention meeting on May 5th. (*Editor's Note: the date has been changed to May 10th*).

The meeting was adjourned.

IN MEMORY...

Veda Parsley

Veda passed from leukemia on her 75th birthday, April 9, 2010, in Portland. Veda was a survivor in the truest sense. She beat cancer three times in her late 30s and early 40s. Her life after those illnesses may best be described by the quote, "Get busy living, or get busy dying." She chose to get busy living. After her early bouts with cancer, her talents as an artist, teacher, mentor and decorator blossomed. With her business partner, Lara Ellingsen, she owned and operated **Folk Art by Request** in Gresham for nearly 20 years. In the last few years of her life, she continued to improve and expand as a painter. Like all great artists, she died with a painting left unfinished.

Hey – from sunny Arizona. As many of you know my husband, Dorn and I winter 3-5 months in Arizona. We stay at an RV resort in Tucson where there are many choices of activities. Roberta suggested you might be interested in what we do – we wood carve.

There are 80+ members with 40-50 carving 3½ hrs twice/week. What a way to spend an afternoon! The membership is mostly men with about nine ladies. Classes are offered or special projects or folks can carve on their own. Dues are \$5, which is used for cake or pizza at the end of the season. We show our carvings mid-March during the pancake breakfast where 450+ folks walk through.

Sharing my love of painting as I help others paint their projects is a highlight. They all laugh as I tell/show them how to ‘side-load’ ‘stipple’ ‘dry brush’ and the dreaded ‘back-to-back side-load’ but they are pleased with the results as they begin to master the techniques. When their bird feathers don’t look quite right and they seek advice – they say, ‘yeah, yeah, I know – side load’! Painting on raw wood is different than a finished or flat surface so I learn something new with every project depending on how the carver finishes his/her project. Some just bring me their projects to paint but I encourage them to give it a try and then sit one-one to help them (I didn’t get much carving done this year ☺). This year’s challenge was painting a squirrel, polar bear, cougar, a black chickadee and full-size goose. There are many expert bird and animal carvers so I’m learning a lot and thankful they allow me to experiment on their project.
