FRESH CARROT SALAD by Debbie

1 pound carrots, shredded
½ cup chopped red onion
1 apple cored and chopped
1 cup raisins (any kind, I use Cran-raisins)

Dressing:

2 Tablespoons of cider vinegar
½ to ¾ cup of mayonnaise
2 to 3 tablespoons of sugar

Combine carrots, red onion, apples, and raisins in a bowl.
Add dressing and refrigerate at least 2 hours.

RICE KRISPIE TREATS

Doris Beck brought these amazing Rice Krispie treats to the Trudy Beard seminar and we all loved them. I have made them several times now.

1 cup butter
8 Milky Way bars (sliced to melt quickly)
2 cups marshmallows
6 cups Rice Krispies Cereal

Melt the butter, add the sliced Milky Way bars stirring all the time. Add marshmallows and stir until melted. Add the Rice Krispies and stir until coated. Pour into a buttered 9x13 inch pan and cut as soon as cooled.

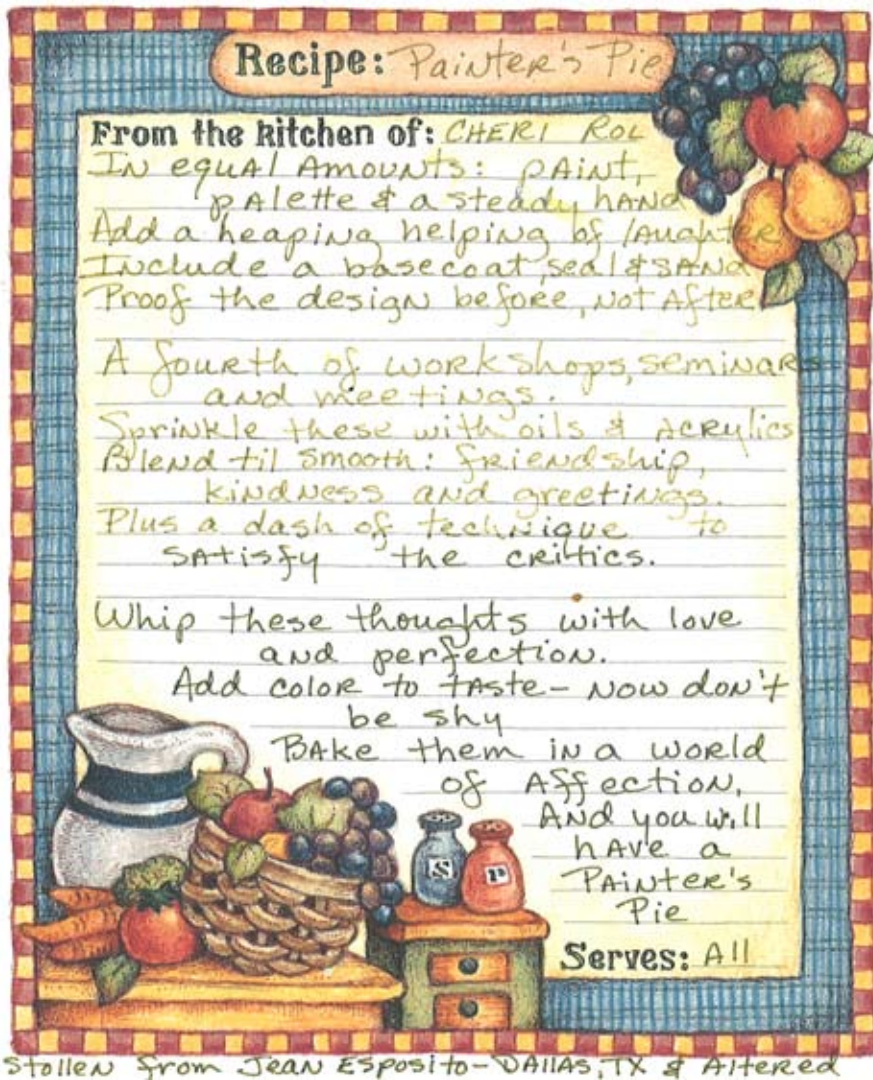

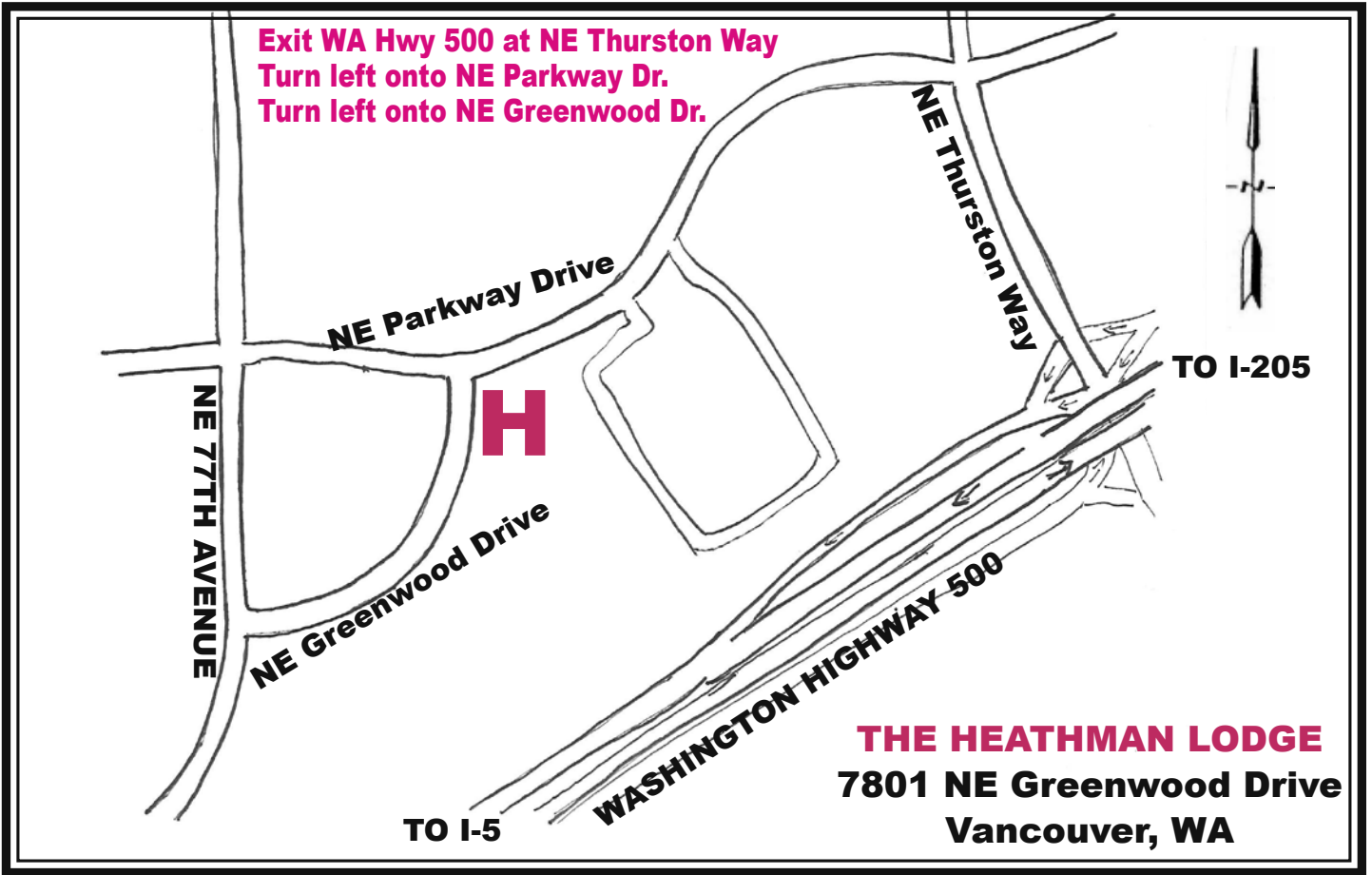

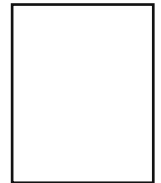
