Chapter Meeting Minutes

October 5, 2013

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 10:10 am. There being 37 members present, a quorum was declared. Introductions were made.

Executive Committee Reports:

President Terry Banton announced the 2013 post-convention meeting will be held November 23rd at the Union Hall at 8:00 am. Surveys are to be sent to attendees, vendors, and teachers by Monica to complete.

Raffle items are on display today at the back of the room. JoSonja has agreed to paint an ornament for our raffle.

The Christmas Brunch will be Saturday, December 7, 10:00 am, at the Red Lion Hotel on the Columbia River. The cost will be \$15.00 for chapter members and \$20.00 for non-members or guests. We need more volunteers to decorate tables. Call Terry if you can decorate a table. If you would like to participate in the gift exchange this year, (or a handmade item) please bring a wrapped gift of approximately \$10.00 in value to exchange. Consensus was reached that we not have an ornament exchange this year.

Terry announced that we still need volunteers to come forward for elected office and for committee chairs. Dinky Davis and Helga Nichols volunteered to be our new Memory Box Chairs. Thank you!

Treasurer Judy Elam reported the following activity for August and September. Beginning combined (convention and chapter) balance of \$134,739.85. Our Income was \$22,042.23. Expenses were \$20,042.23. Our ending balance for September is \$136,739.03. Paychecks for all convention teachers have been written, but some have not been mailed, pending signed W-9 Tax forms. There are some outstanding convention bills pending.

The proposed chapter operating budget for 2014 was printed in the September/October newsletter. Motion made by Joan Porter, seconded by Linda Aten, to approve the proposed 2014 budget as printed in the newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

Joan Porter announced that the Executive Board came to consensus to pay tuition for Treasurer Judy Elam to attend a Quick-Books class at Mt. Hood Community College. She will share the training with other board members and the next Treasurer. This will help to streamline our record keeping, and allow our members to more easily access our financial records online.

Advisor Pam Murphy reported the 2013 convention was successful. Convention participants included 40 teachers, 23 exhibitors, and 350 registered attendees. This was our first year with a new venue, so there were a few unforeseen logistical issues, but most of the feedback was very positive and enthusiastic. We still have a few bills to pay, but should show a nice profit. Pam thanked all chapter members who helped to make our convention a success.

Committee Reports:

Newsletter/Website: Terry Banton announced that the newsletter deadline is October 15. Please be sure that Lupe has her information by then. Lupe is back home now and recovering from her broken leg. We miss her, and send our best wishes for recovery from her broken leg.

Membership: Joan Porter has membership renewal forms with her today, and encouraged members to renew soon if you haven not already done so. Joan requested members to submit cover art for our 2014 directory.

Education: Chair Georgia Magarrell announced Mary Gibilisco will be teaching in February. The medium will be Genesis Oils and lunch will be potluck. Brenda Stewart will teach April 5 and 6. Mary Wiseman will be here October 18 and 19. *Learn to Paint* will be held at the Clackamas County Fair in August. The fairgrounds are in Canby. Sherry Nelson has agreed to teach a seminar for us in 2015.

Nominating Committee: Peggy Smith reported that no volunteers have come forward to run for elected office. Terry Banton asked members to consider serving on the board prior to our elections.

Retreat: Terry Banton reported the retreat will be held in June this year. Debbie Gill asked the membership if the chapter should continue to use the Collins Retreat Center in future years. Consensus was reached that we continue to hold our retreat at the Collins Retreat facility. Debbie asked the membership to inform the board or Cathy Schmidt of any ideas or suggestions they have for retreat classes.

Door prize winners were Judy Zogg, Terry Banton, Roberta Wells, and Katrina Peterson.

Election of Officers: Stephanie Graiff agreed to serve as Secretary for 2014, and was nominated from the floor by Debbie Gill, Seconded by Nancy Baur. Georgia Magarrell volunteered to run for Vice-President/President Elect, and was nominated from the floor by unanimous consent. There being no opposing candidates for office, the following slate of officers for 2014 was adopted by unanimous vote: President – Terry Banton; Vice-President/President Elect – Georgia Magarrell; Secretary – Stephanie Graiff; Treasurer – Judy Elam; Advisor – Pam Murphy.

Consensus was reached to pay the tuition for a QuickBooks class at Mt. Hood Community College for Judy Elam. The instruction and training will be passed on to the next treasurer.

Terry Banton stated we need more volunteers to run for elected office of the chapter. We also will need more committee chairs

GENESIS ARTIST COLORS - You can start today and finish today. And if you do not finish your masterpiece today, you can walk away from it without any cleanup and come back tomorrow, next week or next month because this paint does not dry until you are ready to heat-set. Several of us have the dryers, so even when Mary goes back home, you can use our dryers. With Genesis, any brush will give you the desired results. It is not necessary to invest in expensive brushes just make sure you "cream" the paint on your palette before you apply it to your project.
